Sunday Exploration:

A nice variety of birds were sighted along the trails. The usual visitors: herons, egret, ibis, American crow, Fish crow, American robin, Northern mockingbird, red-winged blackbirds, common grackle, northern cardinal, mourning doves, eastern bluebird, and blue jay, were joined this morning by tufted-titmouse, Carolina chick-a-dee, tree swallow, eastern phoebe, hermit thrush, and ring-billed gulls. Gadwall, blue-winged teal, green-winged teal, and American wigeon were represented as well as bald eagle, northern harrier, and a merlin. The red-bellied, downy, and pileated woodpeckers were among yellow-bellied sapsuckers and northern flicker.
